#### Newman Reading Group, Saturday 28 January

The 2017 London Newman Lecture was given by Frank Field MP earlier in March his topic was *From Poverty to Life Chances*. His excellent talk concerned the life chances of children and the need for intervention at a very early stage. Reception teachers all said that a child's life chances are determined pre-school and the home learning environment is crucial. He made a plea for the support of mothers, pre and after birth, and placed particular emphasis on the mental health of the mother.
