The 2014 London Newman Lecture was given by **Dr. Gemma Simmonds CJ** on the theme **Sacraments: Doing the Joined-Up Living?** at Heythrope College. This was the second year at the College and the venue once again proved to be very comfortable and attracted a good number.

Dr Gemma Simmonds, a senior lecturer in pastoral theology at Heythrop College, University of London, explained that 'being Christians in the Catholic tradition requires us to live sacramentally, to understand that the ordinary tasks within our ordinary lives are signs that signify that life matters and that being human makes a difference'. She asked us to consider what it means to 'live' the sacraments and not just to 'receive' them.
