## Short report for AGM

- Following the Hinsley Hall assembly, Council convened a group by inviting Circle representatives. Winnie Flanagan, Michael Jameson, Arthur Skelton and Maureen Thomas volunteered. Brian Hamill and I were added from Council. Kevin Lambert, Marie Rose Low and Barry Riley have been kept informed.
- 2. It's fair to say that our progress has not been properly interactive. The Circle representatives had/have quite different views on communication issues/priorities, and partly because of the geographical spread we operated through email. One member thinks that we should be asked formalise our processes, also obtaining agreement for a budget to enable proper meetings and fuller debate.
- 3. In the circumstances, and to at least map out the field, I drafted an interim report, still open for members comment. Some copies are available today and I can circulate further by email.
- 4. In summary I think that in communication there are two large intractable areas:
  - a. Getting out message out to a younger, especially University, or immediately post-University, groups
  - b. Establishing a closer working/understanding with the Catholic Bishops Conference
- 5. Other key points such as:
  - a. Council communicating with Circles
  - b. Circles communicating with local parishes/ ecumenical contacts etc

Are being addressed with greater or lesser degrees of vigour through existing mechanisms, and there is a need to for wider use of, for example the website, before attempting anything more elaborate.

6. Others may disagree with this summary view, and I suggest that the new Council should be invited to discuss the interim report and to assess what further to do.
