## 2016 PILGRIMAGE

Thank you for your request for information on our pilgrimage to Rome in 2016, staying at the English College's retreat and pilgrimage centre of Palazzola outside of the city of Rome.

**PALAZZOLA** is a former Franciscan monastery, built on the site of a Roman villa, that occupies a dramatically beautiful position high above Lake Albano in the Alban Hills, 18 miles from the centre of Rome. The Cistercians, who formed the first community here, built the Church of Our Lady of the Snows in the 13th century. In 1919, after 500 years as a Franciscan House, the English College bought Palazzola as a summer retreat from the heat of Rome.



The Villa Palazzola stands in 16 acres of mainly wooded land. From the terraced garden, there is a breathtaking view over Lake Albano, with its steep wooded sides, to the Pope's summer residence at Castel Gandolfo and down over the city of Rome and across the countryside to the sea.

The villa has been modernised in a way that retains its simplicity and character. <u>Standard</u> room accommodation in the 13<sup>th</sup> century Old Wing is provided in simply furnished rooms with washbasins providing hot and cold water along with shared modern bathroom and shower facilities. There is a lift in the Old Wing. <u>En-suite</u> rooms are provided in different locations around the Villa including the 17<sup>th</sup> century New Wing annex. Towels and soap are provided.



Main meals are are taken outside (weather permitting) on the terrace or in the 18th century panelled refectory of the Friars. Coffee and tea making facilities are available 24 hours a day and there is a well-stocked bar (with plenty of soft drinks and ice-creams!). Palazzola is so beautiful that you can happily stay put for the entire time just enjoying being there! At Palazzola there are many things to do - reading in the garden, enjoying the swimming pool, local walks through the woods, watching the sunset with a drink in hand, sitting quietly in the chapel - or just do nothing! For those more active you can enjoy walks through the woods to nearby villages, play tennis and other games on the court, and take the bus/train into Rome.

#### PROGRAMME

- Fri 16 Arrival in Rome and transfer to Palazzola. Lunch. Afternoon excursion around the lake to visit the village of Castel Gandolfo for a private tour of the Papal Gardens (or to visit the Papal Palace) followed by free time for a coffee or ice-cream and shopping in the village. Evening Mass. Welcome Reception. Dinner.
- Sat 17 Morning excursion to the Benedictine Monastery of Sacro Speco at Subiaco for a tour by one of the monks and Mass. Lunch in a local restaurant. Afternoon return to enjoy Palazzola. Dinner.
- Sun 18 Early morning transfer to the Vatican for the Jubilee of Mercy walk from Castel San Angelo to the Holy Door and to afterwards to attend the International Pilgrim Mass in St Peter's Basilica. Midday Angelus with Pope Francis. Lunch. Afternoon visit the Basilica of St Paul's Outside the Walls (with its many English connections and also the mosaic portraits of the 266 Popes) and to join the Benedictine monks for vespers. Dinner.
- Mon 19 Morning Mass and free morning to enjoy Palazzola. Lunch. Afternoon excursion to the visit to Cistercian Abbey at Fossanova (now run by the Franciscans), where the Dominican St Thomas Aquinas died. Dinner.
- Tue 20 Full-day excursion to the Benedictine Monastery at Monte Cassino for a tour and Mass. Lunch in local restaurant. Afternoon return via the Cistercian Monastery at Casamari for vespers. Dinner
- Wed 21 Morning excursion to visit the private Ninfa Gardens (a superb early 20th century plant collection amongst medieval ruins, now looked after by the World Wide Fund For Nature and now referred to as the *most romantic garden in the world*) and the the Cistercian Abbey of Valviscolo. Lunch. Free afternoon to enjoy Palazzola (or to visit Castel Gandolfo). Evening Mass. Dinner.
- Thu 22 Morning departures. Morning excursion around the lake to visit the village of Castel Gandolfo for a private tour of the Papal Gardens (or to visit the Papal Palace) followed by free time for a coffee or ice-cream and shopping in the village. Midday Mass. Lunch. Afternoon departures.
